

## Sakura Photo Banners

1. Take leftover photos – bad photos, double prints, whatever you have lying around. Note: The photos must be professionally printed or printed on a printer that seals the print. Ink Jet prints will run.

2. Trim photos as necessary.

Place vinyl letter stickers in the center of each photo to spell out your word of choice.

4. Use the Sakura Koi Coloring Brush Markers to doodle all over your photos. The brush tips make it super easy to cover a lot of surface quickly. Note: The dark areas of the photo won't take the ink, so focus your energies on the lighter colored areas.

5. Punch holes at the top of each photo and string them together to create a wonderful and unique banner!
