



# OIL PASTEL RESIST

## Supplies

- Sakura Cray-Pas Expressionist Oil Pastels
- Sakura Koi Watercolor Pocket Box
- Paintbrush
- Jar or container of water
- Watercolor paper 12x12
- Sakura Permaquaque Marker
- Plain White Paper
- DCWV Border Punch Strips – Brights
- Brother ScanNCut
- DCWV Violet Leaf Stack
- Scissors
- Adhesive
- 3x4" photo
- Sakura Quickie Glue Pen
- Sakura Pigma Micron .08
- My Mind's Eye Enamel Dots
- Optional: spray bottle of water

## Instructions

1. Using a white Cray-Pas Oil Pastel draw a large messy circle and several small circles across the watercolor paper.
2. Add yellow, red, and orange Cray-Pas Oil Pastel to your white doodles.
3. Paint the watercolor paper with blue and green watercolor. (Note: You can spray the watercolors with water before you begin painting to make them a bit "juicier.") You don't have to cover the entire sheet of watercolor paper. Note that the oil pastels resist the watercolor paints!

4. While the paint is drying, write out your title on a piece of plain white paper.
5. Scan your title into the Brother ScanNCut and cut it out of one of the red strips from the DCWV Border Punch Strips stack. Note: You can use the machine's scanning function to ensure you get perfect placement of the title on the strip.
6. Cut two strips of patterned paper from the DCWV Violet Leaf Stack – one purple and one teal.
7. Adhere the photo in the red circle.
8. Use the Sakura Quickie Glue Pen to adhere the title to the layout.
9. Use a Sakura Pigma Micron in a large size, such as a .08, to write your journaling.
10. Adhere three enamel dots just above your journaling to finish the layout.
