

Scrapbook Soup TV Project Instructions by: May Flaum

Brother ScanNCut, cardstock, patterned paper, stickers, alphabet stamps, doily,

thread, ink, pen, and tags

When it comes to pocket pages, I don't often utilize the special page protectors but I love recreating the look on my traditional scrapbooking layouts. I love doing this because it allows me to go over the edges of the squares (or rectangles) and create layouts that are somewhere between traditional and pocket pages. Such fun!

## Instructions:

- 1. Cut photos 3 ¾" square
- 2. Use Brother ScanNCut to cut:
  - two 3 ¾" rounded corner squares from patterned paper
  - a 3 ¾" square with tab this makes a great pocket!
  - 3 ½" heart from patterned paper
- 3. Adhere the squares and photos to the background. Only adhere the center pocket on the edges (sides and bottom).
- 4. Type journaling on the computer and print out on white cardstock
- 5. Add word stickers to photos.

6. Stamp, outline, scan, and cut the title letters (using ScanNCut machine).

7. Adhere the heart and stamped title letters to the bottom corner, along with a gold doily.

8. Add some decorative stitching (optional)

9. Add letter stickers, date, and butterfly to the heart to complete the title area.

10. Work on the center pocket to finish the layout. First, use ink on the edges. Then use a pen to draw on the dashes around the edge. Now tuck a few tags (and stickers) into the pocket. Add stickers and resin bird to the front of the tag.







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
