SUPPLIES

- Sakura Pen Touch Color Pens
- pattern
- Brother ScanNCut
- Graftix Arts Matte Shrink Plastic tinfoil
- Heat Gun
- Wooden Skewer

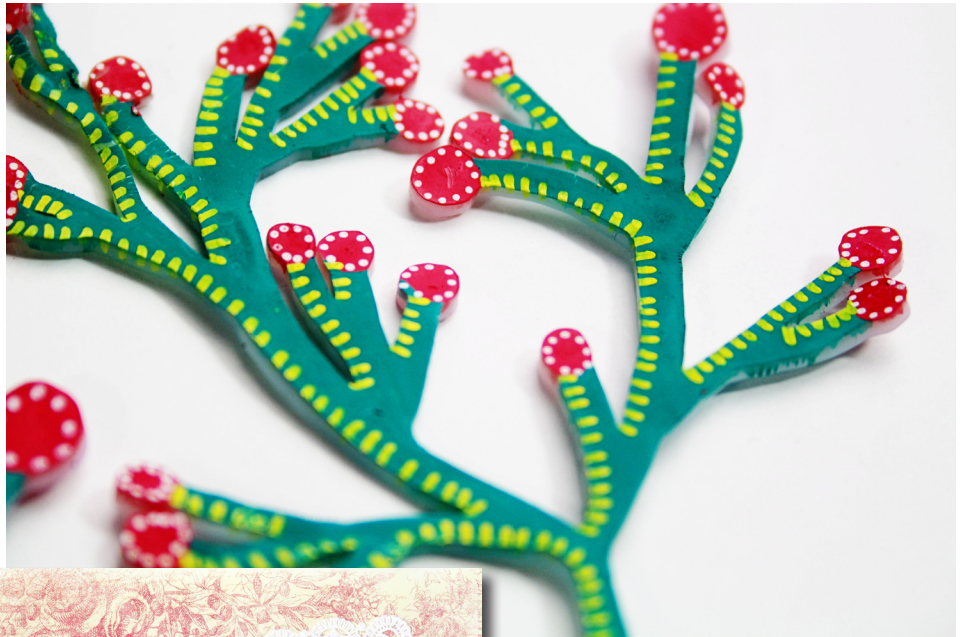
INSTRUCTIONS

Your scrapbook layouts are so much more special when you take the time to make custom embellishments!

1. Cut your pattern out of shrink plastic. I used the Brother ScanNCut to cut out my pattern, but you can also use scissors. (See the notes below for instructions on using the ScanNCut.)
2. Color the pattern using the Sakura Pen Touch Color Pens. I used red for the berries and green for the stems.
3. Add a layer of detail once the initial color layer has dried. I added white dots in the berries and yellow dashes to the stems.
4. Place the colored shrink plastic onto the tinfoil. Use the heat gun to begin heat up the shrink plastic. It should begin to melt. Use the bamboo skewer to help prevent the shrink plastic from curling onto itself.
5. Allow the shrink plastic to cool and harden. And you're done!

Now you're ready to add your custom embellishment to your scrapbook page, art journal, or card! You can even wear it as a piece of jewelry!

ScanNCut Instructions

1. Place the pattern in the Scanning Mat. Load the mat into the ScanNCut.
2. Choose Scan>Scan To Cut Data.
3. Choose the first option, or outline, and Save the pattern into

- your machine.
4. Return to the Home screen by choosing the Home button.
5. Unload the scanning mat.
6. Load a Standard Mat with a sheet of Shrink Plastic attached to it.
7. Chose Pattern>Saved Designs and locate the pattern you just saved. Choose it.
8. Resize it as you wish.
9. Choose Cut. I used a Standard Blade at a blade depth of 7, a speed of 1 and a cut pressure of 4. However ma-



chines do vary, so it's a good idea to test your own machine to find the right settings for you.
