



Stenciled Scrapbook Page

SUPPLIES

- Balzer Designs “Pods on Sticks” stencil from The Crafter’s Workshop in 6x6 and 12x12
- Balzer Designs “Tiled Flower” stencil from The Crafter’s Workshop in 12x12
- White Cardstock
- Patterned Paper
- wet adhesive
- Deli Paper (or another thin paper)
- acrylic paint
- old credit card or hotel room key
- oil pastel or crayon
- scissors
- ruler
- ballpoint pen
- foam adhesive
- tape runner
- 3 photos (3x4”)
- Optional: Brother ScanNCut, typewriter, sewing machine, tape

INSTRUCTIONS

Stencils are a quick and easy way to make any scrapbook page sing! They can be used over and over and you can get lots of different looks from the same stencils simply by changing the colors or mediums used!

1. Apply a thick layer of acrylic paint to a piece of deli paper or other thin paper, using a credit card or old hotel room key.
2. Once the paint has dried, place the deli paper over the “Tiled Flower” stencil. You can tape the paper in place if you’d like. Lightly rub an oil pastel or crayon over the top of the stencil to reveal the pattern on the deli paper.
3. Use a ruler to rip the patterned deli



4. paper down to a rectangle approximately 7.5x10”.
4. Use a wet adhesive to attach it on the right-ish side of a 12x12 sheet of white cardstock.
5. Trace the thinnest of the pod shapes from the 12x12 “Pods on Sticks” stencil onto the back of a sheet of patterned paper. Trace the 6x6 version of the “Pods on Sticks” stencil 3 times onto the same piece of paper.
6. Cut out those shapes with scissors.
7. Layer your photos and adhere them to the top of the deli paper.
8. Adhere the pods on sticks to your layout. I used layered foam adhesive
9. to make some of the pods on sticks dimensional.
9. Take some of the excess patterned deli paper and stitch it into two paper ruffles, one narrower than the other. Layer them on top of each other on the right side of the layout. If you don’t have a sewing machine, you can handstitch or simply glue the ruffles.
10. Add your title (mine was cut with the Brother ScanNCut, but you can use letter stickers or hand cut it).
11. Add your journaling (mine was done on a typewriter, but you could do it on your computer or write it by hand).
